**1. IAP Specialty series on Pediatric Cardiology.**



With reduction in infant mortality from preventable causes in many parts of India and the developing world, it is increasingly apparent that pediatric heart diseases are likely to surface as an important priority. Most postgraduate programs in the country are unable to provide structured training in pediatric cardiology because very few facilities have a pediatric heart program. Additionally, many practicing pediatricians have not had training opportunities in Pediatric Cardiology.

This book is written to address the practical needs of practicing pediatricians and postgraduate students. Conceptual framework and core information is provided in key areas in pediatric cardiology. The whole book is written in an easily understandable style. A number of experts from within India and selected authors from overseas have contributed individual chapters.

Pediatric cardiology is a relatively new specialty and numerous advances happen in a relatively short period of time. The second edition has retained the basic structure of the first edition. The individual chapters have been revised to incorporate important advances that have occurred in the last 4 years. The second edition retains a strong clinical focus.

Almost every topic has been covered and chapters on Nursing and End of Life Care have been added as being of paramount importance for a holistic approach towards the care of a very sick child and the family.



The Indian Pediatric Critical Care community is making huge strides in India and this book is one more milestone in our path to deliver quality care to each and every child in India.





The fourth section is a ready reckoner for antimicrobial doses, preparations, side effects and drug interactions. All chapters have been written and revised by well-known academicians and an effort has been made to include relevant latest information and guidelines. It is hoped that this book will be a useful resource for postgraduates and practicing pediatricians alike.




## 6. IAP Textbook of Pediatric Radiology




## 7. IAP Textbook of Pediatric ICU Protocols

would be available in all emergency rooms and pediatric intensive care units as well as in various medical colleges and would be used to improve the outcomes of critically ill children.






## 9. IAP Textbook of Pediatric Infectious Diseases



Atlas of Pediatric Infectious Diseases (APID) has an edge over other publications:


- It is the first of a kind attempt by a developing country from Asia to present a gallery of over 300 crystal clear colorful pictures of pediatric infectious diseases to its readers.

  - This ready reckoner for a spot diagnosis of infectious diseases will certainly find a place in the bookshelves of students, libraries and office chambers of practicing physicians




